OREGON STATE FIRE MARSHAL TRAINING REQUIREMENTS

By accessing the Pacific Pride system with your Metrofueling Cardlock card you are hereby certifying that you have training in accordance with the following:

The Oregon State Fire Marshal requires that all cardlock fueling customers be aware of the proper procedures, safety features, and hazardous materials information before using the site.

The site operator's phone number is 1-800-367-3835. For assistance, or to report a problem please call this number.

No Smoking. Don't smoke while fueling your vehicle. Smoking may cause serious fire or injury.

When fueling at a Pacific Pride site please familiarize yourself with the location of the following emergency equipment:

- A **Fire Extinguisher** is at each site.
- An **Emergency Stop Button** is on each card reader, The emergency shut off switch is within 75 feet of the island and shuts down the entire system from a location other than the fueling island.
- A **Pay Telephone** is located at each site. An emergency call can be placed without a coin. **In case of an emergency dial 911 or 0 for the operator.**

Follow these directions on the proper way to fuel your vehicles.

Stop Your Engine

Stay outside of your vehicle in full view of the nozzle while fueling.

1. Insert nozzle in vehicle tank.
2. Insert card in card reader (remove card immediately).
3. Enter 4 digit Pin number. Press enter.
4. Enter 6 digit odometer, or other number. Press enter.
5. Enter pump number. Press enter. The pump is now activated.
6. Place lever in start position.
7. Activate trigger, Remain outside of your vehicles while fueling.
8. Shut pump off by removing lever to stop position.
9. Return nozzle to the pump.

Do not drive off with the nozzle in your vehicle. But if you do, notify us immediately and there will be no fine or penalty.

All nozzles and hoses at our sites have automatic breakaways for your added protection.

1. Stop Vehicle.
2. Turn pump off.
3. Put nozzle in pump if possible or on the island.
4. Report the incident immediately.
5. Call 1-800-367-3835.

CAUTION ALL FUELS ARE DANGEROUS
Gasoline

Danger, extremely flammable. May be harmful if inhaled. May cause irritation. May be Harmful or fatal if swallowed. May be harmful if absorbed thru the skin.

Long term exposure to vapors has caused cancer in laboratory animals. Keep away from heat, sparks, or flame. Avoid breathing vapor. Use only in well ventilated locations. Avoid contact with eyes and prolonged contact with skin. Keep container closed. Wash thoroughly after handling.

For Use as motor fuel only.

Diesel

Caution, combustible. Diesel may cause irritation to eyes.

Middle Distillates have caused skin cancer and kidney damage in laboratory animals. Avoid contact with eyes. Keep away from heat and flame. Use only in well ventilated locations. Avoid prolonged breathing or mist or vapor. Avoid prolonged or repeated contact with skin. Keep away from container when opening or dispensing.

Wash thoroughly after handling.

PHYSIOLOGICAL EFFECTS

ACUTE

Eyes: Causes slight-moderate eye irritation.

Skin: Moderately irritating: causes redness, edema, or drying of the skin.

Respiratory System : Gas: May cause dizziness, irritation of eyes, nose and throat, vomiting, bluish color of the skin, and central nervous system effects (contracted pupils, loss of reflexes, convulsions, seizures, sudden loss of consciousness, coma and sudden death). Other symptoms are headaches, flushing of the face, nausea, mental confusion, and depression, loss of appetite, blurred speech, and difficulty in swallowing. Diesel: May cause symptoms of drowsiness or narcosis from inhalation of high vapor content.

Chronic: Recent studies with laboratory animals have shown that diesel and gasoline vapors caused kidney damage and kidney cancer in rats and liver cancer in mice.

“If you come into contact with gas or diesel follow these emergency and first aid procedures”

FIRST AID FOR GAS AND DIESEL

Eyes: Flush with water for 15 minutes.

Skin: Wash exposed areas with soap and water.

Ingestion: DO NOT induce vomiting.

May cause chemical pneumonitis. Call a physician.

Inhalation: Should symptoms occur, remove to fresh air. If not breathing, apply artificial respiration.

Other Instructions

Gasoline: Remove gasoline soaked clothing.

“The use of unauthorized containers is prohibited at All Cardlock sites.”

Gasoline and diesel are not to be transported or stored in paper or glass containers.

Please use authorized gasoline and diesel cans only.
